The FCA designation is awarded for outstanding contribution to the Institute, the community and the CA profession. It is the highest honour bestowed by the CA profession.

A holder of a BBA degree with Distinction (UNB) and an MBA in Electronic Commerce (UNB), Cathie qualified as a Chartered Accountant in 1979 with the firm of Lee & Martin Chartered Accountants in Fredericton.

While carrying on a consulting practice in microcomputer accounting systems for small to medium sized businesses, Cathie joined UNB Saint John's Faculty of Business as a part-time lecturer in 1980. She became a full-time lecturer at UNB Saint John in 1982. Currently, Cathie holds the position of Senior Teaching Associate at UNBSJ. She has held a number of administrative positions within her faculty including Director of Undergraduate Studies and Assistant Dean of the Faculty of Business with responsibility for International Programs and External Academic Partnerships. She has also been an invited lecturer in the business schools in Hasselt, Belgium and Alkmaar, Holland.

In addition to her teaching and administrative responsibilities at UNB, Cathie has made a significant contribution to the UNB community through her service on the UNB Board of Governors, UNB Saint John Senate, Chairing the Senate Curriculum Committee, Liaison for the NAFTA Leaders Program, the Search Committee for the 18th President of UNB and Review Committee for Dean of Business. She is currently a member of the UNB Strategic Planning Committee, the UNB Board of Governors, UNB Finance Committee and Investment Committee. Cathie also serves as Treasurer of the Lorenzo Literary Society.

A leader within The New Brunswick Institute of Chartered Accountants ("NBICA"), Cathie has demonstrated outstanding service to the CA profession in New Brunswick. In addition to having served on various committees with the NBICA, Cathie has served as a member of the NBICA Council (2003-2005). She has also served as Secretary Treasurer (2005/2006), Vice-President (2006/2007) and President (2007/2008) to the NBICA.

A recognized leader in accounting education, Cathie served as the NBICA representative on the Task Force to review the Atlantic School of Chartered Accountancy ("ASCA"). She has also served on the ASCA Board of Directors, including a term as Secretary Treasurer and as Chair of the Board of Directors.

Cathie has rendered an outstanding contribution to her community throughout Greater Saint John and New Brunswick.
